Program Highlights:

- Be an educator and role model for 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students from diverse communities around the Puget Sound. The IslandWood School Overnight Program serves a wide variety of schools from King and Kitsap Counties, and over 1000 students each school year who qualify for free and reduced lunch.
- Learn the best practices of environmental, experiential and multicultural education while completing the first year of a two-year Master in Education at the University of Washington or Masters in Teaching/Teaching Certification at City University.
- Live on IslandWood's 255-acre campus featuring five distinct ecosystems and sustainably designed buildings.
- Gain educational outreach experience as a school liaison through IslandWood's School Partnerships Program. You become the link between students' experiences at IslandWood and their home communities through pre and post visits to the classroom.
